

Dr. Peter Weill Biography

Dr. Peter Weill is a computer scientist and organizational theorist known for his expertise in digital technology and enterprise strategy. Weill serves as a professor of information systems research at MIT Sloan School of Management and as chairman of the MIT Center for Information Systems Research. Prior to joining MIT, Weill was professor and foundation chair of management in information systems and a member of the board of directors for Melbourne Business School at the University of Melbourne. He holds a BE in industrial engineering with honors and an MBA with distinction from the University of Melbourne, as well as an MPhil and PhD from the Stern School of Business at New York University.

Weill's research focuses on the intersection of digital transformation, information systems, and business value. At MIT CISR, he leads practical research on how organizations generate business value from information technology, working directly with digital leaders, executives, and boards. Weill is the author of 10 business books, more than 100 MIT CISR research briefings, and numerous articles and podcasts featured in Harvard Business Review, CNB, Directors & Boards, Forbes, MIT Sloan Management Review, and the Wall Street Journal.
